MEMBER COMMENTS

From the Desk of Your Editor:

Here we are ten months into 2009 already and no one has submitted a thing to be included in the “Member Comments” column. Remember, this is your space and, if you don’t fill it, then I have to conjure something up!! This time it’s going to be a short, hopefully interesting, article on Leif Ericson (without the “k”) and why he is important to us. Leiv Eiriksson (same guy) was the son of Eirik the Red, who was also known as Norwegian-born Eirik Thorvaldsson, who explored and colonized the southwestern part of Greenland in 986. We don’t know the date or the place of Leiv Eiriksson’s birth but it is believed that he grew up in Greenland, since his father had been sent back to Greenland in 999 to bring Christianity to its people. There are two theories on the course of events that brought Leiv Eiriksson to North America in 1000 AD but in any event, whether by chance or by design, Leiv Eiriksson was encouraged to explore by the description of possible new lands from seamen who had been forced off course during a fierce storm. He bought a ship and set off to discover a new world. Eiriksson apparently made three landfalls in North America on his journey—Labrador, Newfoundland, and somewhere between Newfoundland and Cape Cod. He named the third spot Vinland and he and his men wintered there returning to Greenland in 1001. While Leiv Eiriksson never returned to North America, his brother and others made several attempts to settle Vinland. These attempts were unsuccessful due to strong friction between the Viking settlers and the native North Americans. In 1964 President Lyndon B. Johnson, backed by a unanimous Congress, proclaimed October 9th to be “Leif Ericson Day” in commemoration of the first arrival of a European on North American soil. Why October 9th? That is the date in 1825 that Norwegian immigrants aboard the *Restauration* landed in the United States. And that’s the saga of Leif Ericson. Now, don’t you wish you had submitted something for this section!!!

Answer to last month’s question: “Norseman” was the name of Chrysler’s \$100,000 experimental car that was on the *Andrea Doria* when it sank on July 26, 1956. (Beware if you are playing Trivial Pursuit with Roseann Mitchell—she seems to know the answers to every question!!!!)
