### From the Desk of Your Editor:

While we were on our way to Colorado, Missouri and Minnesota, our beautiful Poulsbo matriarch, Muriel Williams, went home! Time with her seemed much too short and my heart cried, "Too soon! Too soon!" It is difficult to truly describe the loss of her passing. Selfishly, there was so much more I wanted to learn from her. I'll miss sharing a cup of coffee with her in her apartment. But beyond our relationship, Muriel was so much to so many. As she had noted in the past, she and Poulsbo grew up together and her love for the city was surpassed only by her love for her family. She attended city council meetings regularly way into her 90s and she never shirked her duty which was to try to keep those on City Council on the right path. Her letters to the editor were quite a treasure—succinct and always to the point.

I first knew Muriel simply as the mother of a classmate and later as the spunky lady who voluntarily came to nearly all the council meetings I had to attend. She was also a regular at the historical society meetings. Once we started research for *The Spirit of Poulsbo* history book, it was a joy to spend time with her learning what Poulsbo was like in the early years. I feel fortunate to have gotten to know Muriel during the past few years and to have been able to spend time with her. But she didn't just dwell in the past—Muriel was very much a person of today. She kept herself apprised of things going on in her town, her county, her state and the world. Muriel even wanted to know what was going on in our lodge and she sent money to the lodge from time to time for postage because she didn't have a computer and wanted to be sure to receive her newsletters. Many of us whose lives she touched were away and unable to attend her memorial service but I know she would have told us, "don't change your plans and don't make a fuss" because that was what she was all about. Muriel, you have given so much to Poulsbo and to our lodge—you will be sorely missed!

### *Life's Twists and Turns*

When we think we have all the time in the world to take care of important things, life has a habit of throwing you a curve ball. This happened to my wife (Katy) and me. On June 25<sup>th</sup> we had just finished doing some work around the house and at 4PM I said I had to go to Costco (Tacoma Store) to get a few things. At around 4:30PM I received a call from Katy that she wasn't feeling right and could I please come home. When I got home she was sitting on the couch and her whole right side was in uncontrollable shaking. Immediately we were off to Madigan Army Hospital. Upon arriving she was rushed into the emergency section. The doctors gave her some medication that stopped the shaking. Next came a CAT scan and I was told she had a mass, with signs of bleeding, in the upper left rear side of her head. Their outlook was not optimistic to say the least. The next day she had an MRI and that was soon followed by a PET/CT (you medical folks will know what that is). It was determined she had to be operated on and on June 30<sup>th</sup> she underwent a two-hour operation on her head. The mass turned out to be an old blood clot that had begun bleeding again and began putting pressure on her brain. The surgeon informed me after the operation that she was doing fine and that he could not find any sign of cancer. On July 8<sup>th</sup> I was able to bring her home and she is now being set up to have therapy sessions to help restore the use of her right hand. Like I mentioned at the beginning, you think you have all the time in the world to take care of important matters such as: living will, powers of attorney, wills or trusts, life insurance, disability and long-term care insurance. In less than 30 minutes we went from a woman that was insurable to one that was not insurable. Fortunately, Katy is not totally disabled, but she currently cannot use her right arm and hand. Our daughter, granddaughter and I have pitched in to take up the slack of all the things Katy did around the house. Life has changed in our household and I'm glad that through the help of our attorney we were legally and financially prepared. But not emotionally prepared. An important benefit provided by the Sons of Norway is that each member is entitled to a **Free Financial Review**. This will help to determine if you are prepared.

Norske Dansere, led by well-known Norwegian dance instructor Karin Brennesvik, features several Norwegian dance champions. Karin and her daughter, Arnhild Brennesvik, who is also an accomplished dancer and instructor, will perform intricate bygdedans or country dances: Numedal springar and gangar, pols, telespringar and gangar, along with tremannadans. Also in the group is Tom Lovli and his son, Vetle, who specialize in laus (halling). Tom is a champion dancer of Norwegian halling, an athletic dance which requires exceptional skill and strength combined with grace. He won the Norwegian National Championship in halling dance twice and has performed for the King and Queen of Norway. With them will be traditional fiddler, Oystein Haugen, from Tessungdalen, Tinn community in Telemark near Numedal.

## Memorial & Gift Draft Policy for the Poulsbo Lodge

According to lodge policy, any new or revised policies must be adopted at a regular lodge meeting after the policy is presented at the prior meeting and published in the Måken. The board approved the policy below and presented it to the lodge at the July meeting. It is hereby published in the Måken, and will be voted on at our August meeting.

### Policy on gifts, contributions, donations, memorials and tributes

**1. All gifts to Poulsbo Lodge 2-044, herein called The Lodge, are to be acknowledged by the Lodge Secretary or other designated individual.**

**2. Donors should designate as specifically as possible the purpose of the contribution so that their wishes may be realized.**

**3. In the absence of a specific designation, contributions will be deposited in the Lodge General Operating Account and expended as determined by the Board of the Lodge.**

**4. Large gifts, either living or testamentary, are encouraged. If taxes are a concern, advice is available from the Lodge Foundation Advisor or a tax adviser.**

**5. Lodge members and families may have memorials, tributes or celebration of life of a deceased member. Room rental charges may apply. It is urged that contributions to the Lodge or a suitable area of interest of the Lodge be considered by the next of kin of the deceased. A suitable receptacle for these contributions should be provided.**
